Ernie is a highly sought-after speaker, author and changemaker, who shares meaningful perspectives on creating long-lasting change in policing systems, government institutions and communities at large. Reflecting on his experiences as an Indigenous police officer, Ernie has dedicated his career to advocating for the safety and protection of marginalized populations. He has a passion for progressive leadership and social justice advocacy. Ernie became the third Indigenous police officer in the history of the Saskatoon Police force when he was hired in 1987. Ernie's arrival in Saskatoon coincided with the beginning of tremendous change in both policing and Indigenous ways of life in Canada. It is Ernie's belief that we are all capable of being leaders. Through storytelling, Ernie speaks about his time on the police force as he explores racism, empathy, ambition, and leadership.
